# BOS PUBLIC HEARING RECAP

On November 16<sup>th</sup>, the Board of Supervisors held a public hearing to receive public testimony on EOTC Maps Fv5, Gv2, Hv7.1, Iv2, and Community Maps 1.3 and 6.1.

After receiving public testimony, the Board discussed revising Community Map 1.3 to address the concerns of splitting up the San Gorgonio Pass.

At the conclusion of the public hearing, the Board directed the EOTC to move EOTC Maps F, H, and Community Map 1.3 forward to the ARC for their final consideration.

# ORDER OF PRIORITY

- 1. Population equality of residents of the county as determined by the census.
- 2. Compliance with U.S. Constitution, California Constitution and the Federal Voting Rights Act.
- 3. To the extent practicable, Districts shall be geographically contiguous.
- 4. To the extent practicable, geographic integrity of any local neighborhood or local community of interest shall be respected in a manner that minimizes its division. Importantly, "communities of interest" do not include the relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.

# ORDER OF PRIORITY (CONT.)

- 5. To the extent practicable, Districts of counties shall respect the geographic integrity of a city or census designated place.
- 6. District boundaries should be easily identifiable and understandable by residents. Natural and artificial barriers, streets or boundaries of cities or counties shall bound districts.

7. To the extent practicable, and where it does not conflict with the preceding criteria in this subdivision, supervisorial districts shall be drawn to encourage geographical compactness in a manner that nearby areas of population are not bypassed in favor of more distant populations.

# CITIZEN VOTING AGE POPULATION (CVAP)

- 1) CVAP data is the gold standard used by courts to evaluate Voting Rights Act (VRA) compliance
- 2) CVAP is a reliable measurement for assessing a minority community's voting power, and thus widely accepted for purposes of assessing a vote dilution claim under the VRA
  - a. Luna v. County of Kern, 291 F.Supp.3d 1088 (E.D. Cal. 2018)
  - b. Romero v. City of Pomona, 883 F.2d 1418 (9th Cir. 1989)

# VOTING RIGHTS ACT COMPLIANCE

- Analysis shows Racially Polarized Voting (RPV) exists in every district of Riverside County
- Opportunity-to-elect analysis completed on revised maps
- Each of the maps contains at least two Hispanic/Latino opportunity-toelect districts
- All of the maps meet the Voting Rights Act (VRA) requirements






